## Ktunaxa Grammar Rules-Section #3: Asking a "Do you" or "Can you" Question

The Following is **Section #3** of the Ktunaxa Grammar Rules and is meant to show how to ask a "Do you" or "Can you" question.

Ktunaxa		English Description		
Kin	=	Do you / Can you (singular- one person)		
Examples:				
<u>Kin</u> wu∙katap?	=	Do you see me?		
<u>Kin</u> huŧpaŧnap?	=	Do you hear me?		
<u>Kin</u> upxa?	=	Do you know?		
Kinkiŧ	=	Do you / Can you (plural- more than one person)		
"Kin" and "kiŧ" frame a verb in a "Do you" / "Can you" question to more than one person.				
Examples:				

<u>Kin </u> wu∙katap <u>kiŧ</u> ?	=	Can you all see me?

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<u>Kin</u> huŧpaŧnap <u>kiŧ</u> ?	=	Can you all hear me?	
<u>Kin</u> upxa <u>kiŧ</u> ?	=	Do you all know	?
