Section #3: Asking a “Do you” or “Can you” Question

The Following is **Section #3** of the Ktunaxa Grammar Rules and is meant to show how to ask a “Do you” or “Can you” question.

Ktunaxa		English Description
Kin	=	Do you / Can you (singular- one person)
<u>Examples:</u>		
<u>Kin</u> wu·katap?	=	Do you see me?
<u>Kin</u> huḥpaḥnap?	=	Do you hear me?
<u>Kin</u> upxa _____?	=	Do you know _____?
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Kin_____kiḥ	=	Do you / Can you (plural- more than one person)
“Kin” and “kiḥ” frame a verb in a “Do you” / “Can you” question to more than one person.		
<u>Examples:</u>		
<u>Kin</u> wu·katap <u>kiḥ</u> ?	=	Can you all see me?

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Kin huṭpaṭnapkiṭ?

=

Can you all hear me?

Kin upxakiṭ?

=

Do you all know _____?
