Ktunaxa Grammar Rules-Section #5: Using "Would" / "Should"

The Following is **Section #5** of the Ktunaxa Grammar Rules and is meant to show the use of "would" / "should".

Ktunaxa		English Description			
xma	=	Would / Should			
"xma" is a word meaning "would" or "should" and <u>can be used alone</u> or <u>in a</u> combination with pronoun words.					
<u>"xma" alone-</u> When you use the word "xma" <u>by itself with a verb</u> it means <u>he</u> or she would / should.					
Example:					
<u>Xma</u> ski i ha i ḋantik.	=	He / She should go along.			
<u>Xma</u> + <u>hu</u> = <u>xmau</u>	=	Means "I should". If it is combined with "ała", it means "we should".			
Examples:					
<u>Xmau</u> ?anmiti ka l ań.	=	<u>I should</u> throw my shoes out.			
<u>Xmau</u> ski l ?anmit <u>ala lannis.</u>	=	<u>We should</u> throw your shoes out.			

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<u>Xma</u> + <u>hin</u> = <u>Xma∙n</u>	=	"You should" (<u>singular</u> - one person)
<u>Xma·n kiŧ</u>	=	"You should" (<u>plural</u> - more than one)

"Xma·n" combined with "kił" in a verb, means "You should" plural- more than one.

Examples:

<u>Xma∙n</u> ?anmiti.	=	You should throw it out.
<u>Xma∙n</u> ?anmit <u>kiŧ</u> ni.	=	You, (you people) should throw it out.
<u>Xma∙n</u> ἐinaxi.	=	You should go.
<u>Xma∙n</u> ∉xana?ti.	=	You should let him know.
<u>Xma∙n</u> ἐkaxi.	=	You should come.
