Ktunaxa Grammar Rules-Section #6: Verb Tenses - Present Tense & Future Tense

The Following is **Section #6** of the Ktunaxa Grammar Rules and is meant to show the use of Verb tenses - "Present Tense" and "Future Tense".

Ktunaxa	English Description				
Present Tense					
skikiŧ	Shows that something is happening <u>right now</u> .				

The word <u>"skikit" before an action word</u> (verb or verb phrase) shows that something is happening right now or presently.

Examples- When responding to a question such as, "What are you doing?":

Hu <u>skikiŧ</u> ?itkini kikiŧ.	=	I am preparing a meal.
Hu <u>skikiŧ</u> ?ikni.	=	I am eating.
<u>Skikiŧ</u> ?itkiniŧni yaqsu?miŧ.	=	They are making a boat.

Future Tense					
¢xaŧ	=	Shows that something will be happening <u>in the future</u> .			
The word " <u>cxaŧ</u> " <u>before a verb</u> shows that something will be happening in the future.					
Examples:					
Hu <u>øxaŧ</u> ?itkini kikiŧ	=	I will prepare a meal			
Hu <u>øxaŧ</u> ἀ inaxaŧaʔni ʔakikŧuʔnam.	=	We will be going to town.			
Hu <u>øxaŧ</u> ?ituġŧiŧqni	=	I will write
